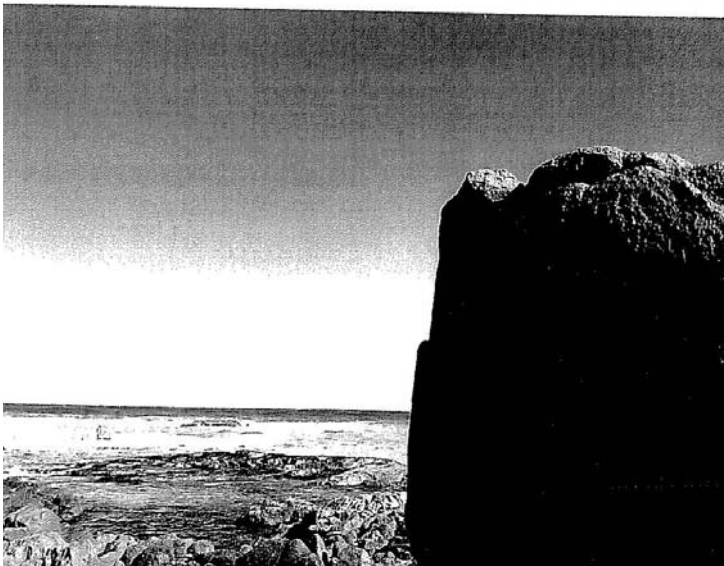
My Treasure
