Dear parents, carers and friends of our school,

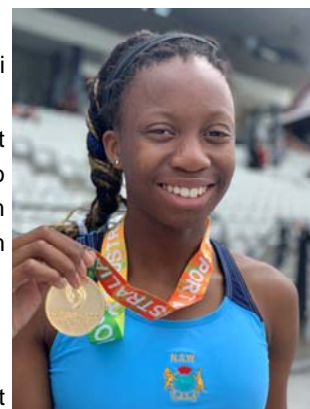
Week 8 is going to be a very busy week. We have now moved into summer and it is getting a lot warmer. Please ensure your child has their school hat and a bottle of water each day.

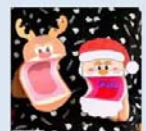
