The canteen will soon be taking orders for reusable lunch order bags, these bags can be pre-ordered at the canteen.

We REALLY need some more helpers though! Helping out doesn't need to take up a lot of your time. We would love to have some people volunteer to take on small jobs such as

- Collect the clothes and wash & dry them at the laundromat (cost paid for by the P&C)
- Iron and hang stock.
- Mend buttons & patch holes.
- Complete the inventory.
- Clean the store area.
- Manage the shop finances.
- Source and manage stock.

The plan is to stock the shop with donated uniforms and also lost items left in the school yard.
