There may be some members of our community who remember him and the great contributions he made to our school during his time as Principal. Mr Brown was Principal of Nelson Bay School, here at our site from 1985 to Aug 1990. The school changed to become Shoal Bay Public School in 1991. Our condolences to his families and friends.

On Friday, 5 July we are inviting you and your children to join us in Nude Food Friday! This is simply packing a lunchbox without any plastic or other non-recycle or reusable packaging. Here are some tips to help you on your way to ditching the plastic and reducing waste:

- Place snacks and drinks in reusable containers Bake your own muesli bars and cookies (recipes coming soon!)
- Replace cling film and ziplock bags with a beeswax or cotton sandwich wrap (available at Nelson Bay Health Foods)
- Cut up fruit and vegetables for snacks
- Buy a large tub of yoghurt and place individual serves in a reusable container and provide a reusable spoon
- Buy snacks like chips, biscuits and popcorn in bulk rather than individually wrapped

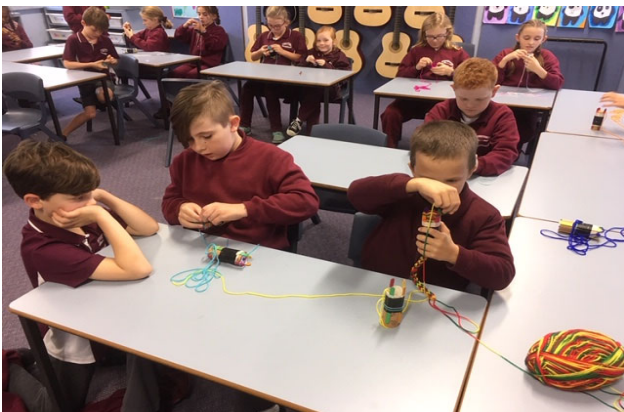

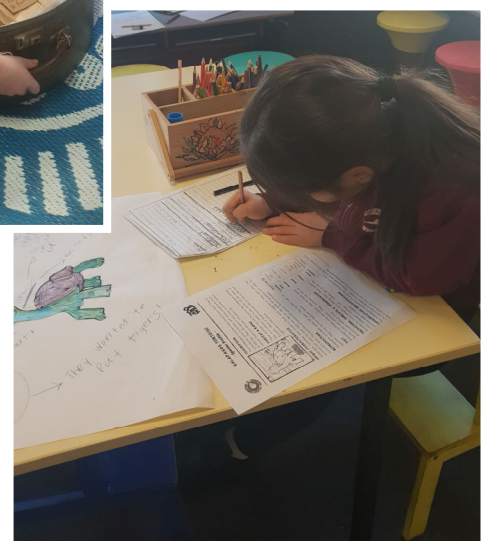
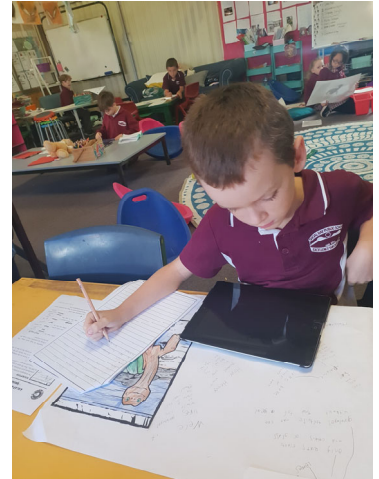
