In this dynamic 60 to 90-minute seminar, psychologist, Jocelyn Brewer, will help parents and carers understand aspects of technology, app and video game design that prove to be so seductive (and perhaps even 'addictive') to young people. Her fear-free, practical approach will help parents build skills to communicate with their young people, implement boundaries and consequences for behaviours (both online and off) and assist them to identify and manage their emotions, time and choices.

She will explore the ways young people use technology, some of the features of tech design that makes it so enticing and hard to put down, and the impacts on wellbeing.

Jocelyn will introduce her concept of Digital Nutrition™ as a positive framework for shaping healthy tech habits and a diverse digital diet, as well as how to apply the 3M's (mindful, meaningful and moderate) to online activities.
