Swimming Scheme

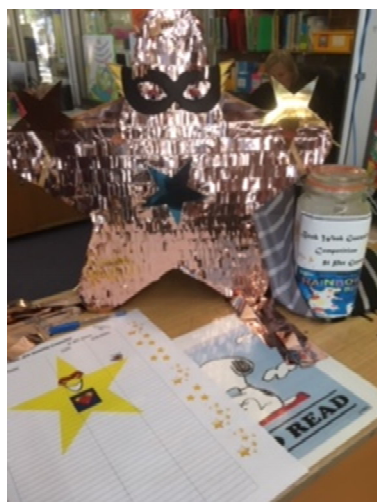
